Finding 8 (Onsite 1407): During on-site review it was found the SFA's food safety plan was not being correctly implemented. The food safety plan safety checklist was to be completed daily, but was being completed monthly. Finding 9 (Onsite 1410): During the on-site review one item was determined noncompliant. Chocolate donuts were made with enriched flour only. According to CFR 210.10(c)(2)(iv) all grains made with enriched flour must be made with at least 50% whole grains. Finding 6 (Offsite 1000-1006): Local Wellness Policy does not contain all 4) required elements. According to 7 CFR 210.31, each local educational agency must establish a local school wellness policy for all schools participating in the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program under the jurisdiction of the local educational agency. The local school wellness policy is a written plan that includes methods to promote student wellness, prevent and reduce childhood obesity, and provide assurance that school meals and other food and beverages sold and otherwise made available on the school campus during the school day are consistent with applicable minimum Federal standards. 5) Finding 5 (Offsite 703): A walk-in cooler totaling over \$5,000 was purchased without State Agency approval. According to FNS SP 31-2014 equipment purchased from the Nonprofit School Food Service Account (Fund 51) totaling over \$5,000 must be approved the State Agency prior to purchase or be on the State Agency approved equipment list. 6) Finding 10 (Offsite 1601): The SFA did not notify eligible households of the availability and location of free meals for students via the Summer Food Service Program.
