

STATE AGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW SUMMARY

A grain was offered daily, however the minimum daily and weekly requirements were not met. 2) For the week of menu review, the lunch menu for the K—5 and the 9-12 grade groups did not meet the minimum daily fruit requirement. Fruit was offered daily, however the minimum required portion size was not met. 3) For the week of menu review, the lunch menu for the K-5 grade group did not meet the minimum weekly requirement for the beans/legumes vegetable subgroup. 4) For the week of menu review, the breakfast menu for the K-5, 6-8, and 9-12 grade groups did not meet the minimum daily fruit requirement.
