


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in South Dakota was 222. This was not significantly different from the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in South Dakota in 2017 (222) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (220) and in 2003 (222).
- The percentage of students in South Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (35 percent) and in 2003 (33 percent).
- The percentage of students in South Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 69 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (68 percent) and in 2003 (69 percent).

In 2017, the average score in South Dakota (222) was





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2017, female students in South Dakota had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 5 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (20 points).
