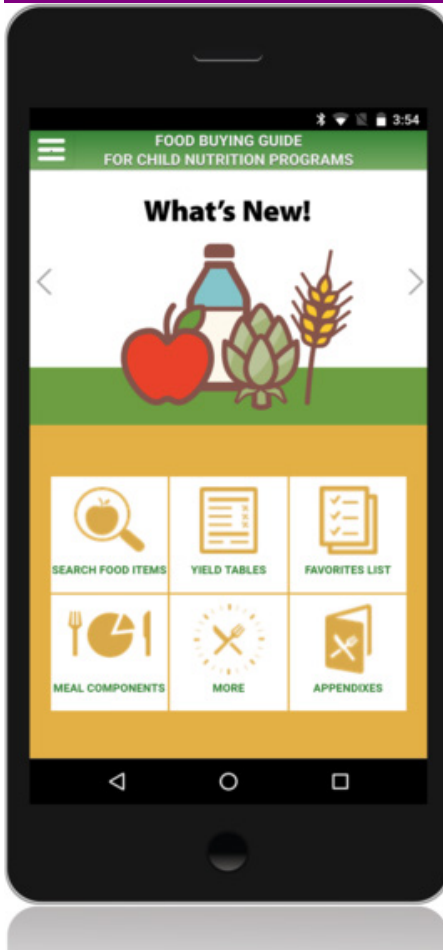


What's New: FNS's Official Texting Number 97779

Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs (FBG) Mobile App

The Food Buying Guide (FBG) is the essential resource for food yield information for all Child Nutrition Programs (CNP). The FBG assists CNP operators, food manufacturers, and other stakeholders with:

- Purchasing the correct amounts of foods for Child Nutrition meal programs
- Determining the contribution that each food makes toward meal pattern requirements

The [FBG Mobile App](#) provides menu planning features at your fingertips! You can easily search and navigate food yields for foods typically served in Child Nutrition Program settings, compare food yields to determine the best food to purchase, and create favorite foods lists! Promoting Summer Meals!

It is never too early to create an outreach plan to promote Summer Meals in your communities. Here are 3 ways you can start!

1. Connect with your local radio stations. You can use the [Radio Locator](#) to find stations near you. FNS also has transcripts and PSAs available for download [online](#).
2. Connect with schools in your communities and ask if they can help you reach children before they leave for the Summer. Schools can help by distributing flyers or emailing parents or guardians. FNS recently updated our promotional materials. They are now available for download [online](#).
3. Check in with your State agency and local anti-hunger advocacy groups for free banners. Having an inventory of banners can help you decide how much you should print.
