	 Finding #7: (Offsite #1208): SFA is not tracking their training hours on an annual basis, which is required in the Final Rule for Professional Standards.
	6) Finding #8: (Offsite 1601): SFA was unaware that it is required to inform families of the availability of meals offered through the Summer Food Service Program before the end of the school year. SFAs must cooperate with Summer Food Service Program sponsors to distribute materials to inform families of the availability and location of free Summer Food Service Program meals for students when school is not in session. During the on-site review, technical assistance was given to SFA about the requirement and ideas on how to inform families.
