According to 7 CFR 210.13 Facilities Management, the school food authority must develop a written food safety program that covers any facility or part of a facility where food is stored, prepared, or served. Finding 4 (Offsite 1601): SFA did not inform households of the availability of SFSP. No documentation available. According to 7 CFR 210.12 Student, Parent, and Community Involvement, school food authorities must cooperate with Summer Food Service Program sponsors to distribute materials to inform families of the availability and location of free Summer Food Service Program meals for students when school is not in session.
