Learn about Lakota history and culture. **Experience** hands-on engagement with traditional and contemporary Lakota art and objects from the museum's collection. **Read** selected excerpts from classics of Lakota literature. **Create** exhibits and classroom activities based upon the seminar's topics and themes.

Session topics include the origins and development of the Oceti Sakowin confederacy, Lakota history and culture, foundations of Lakota spirituality, Lakota star knowledge and winter counts, contemporary tribes and reservations, and Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS). We will explore these topics using multimedia, including art works, museum objects, photographs, readings, film and discussion.

The workshop emphasizes the critical thinking required by the Common Core Standards, as well as approaches to integrating the content across the curriculum. Workshop instruction is based on collaboration and offers frequent interaction between presenters and participants.

Registration Fee of \$250 includes enrollment in Oceti Sakowin History & Culture seminar (\$50), a copy of *Oceti Sakowin Origins and Development* handbook (\$16), *Flags of Tribes in South Dakota* poster (\$10), course packet of readings, Certificate of Completion, door prizes, and two workshop receptions. Participants are responsible for all other expenses.

College Credit can be earned by successfully completing this workshop. Enrollment fee for two hours of graduate or undergraduate credit is \$90, which will be collected the first day of the workshop.
