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## SD-ELP (ACCESS Updates)

### Testing Window

- Testing window closes on Friday, Feb. 27, 2026

### Newly Identified English Learner Students

- Any student who comes into your district during the testing window will need to be either added to DRC or transferred in DRC from another SD school. Follow the [New Student Upload Process](#).
- When administering WIDA ACCESS Online, ensure students are entered in the appropriate registrations and accommodations are added if needed.

### Test Materials

- SD DOE orders all materials for the ACCESS and Alternate ACCESS assessments. If additional materials need to be ordered, you will need to place an [Additional Order](#).
- Please make sure that you check for coverage of materials before placing an additional order.
  - Last day to place an additional order will be Friday, Feb. 20 at 3:30 p.m. CT

### Returning Materials

- Must be Postmarked by March 9, 2026
  - DRC would like items returned ASAP
- Items that MUST be returned
  - All test booklets (collected in plastic bags)
  - All ACCESS Paper Test Administrator Scripts
  - ACCESS Online Test Administrator Scripts for grade 1 and grades 2-3
  - Listening and Speaking Test CDs
  - All large print, braille, Kindergarten ACCESS (including low-vision) and Alternate ACCESS test materials

### State General Assessment Accommodations for Grades 3-8

Recommended deadline for submitting forms (through TIDE) is **Feb. 1, 2026**. TIDE forms include:

- Assessment Non-Embedded Accommodations Request
- General Assessment Print on Demand Request
- General Assessment Reading Passages Request
- Special Accommodation Consideration Request
- Speech-to-Text and/or Word Completion Request Form

### SD-ACT Updates (for public-school districts only)

#### Accommodations for SD-ACT

Districts should be finishing up with requesting accommodations for the SD-ACT. District staff will need to create an account in Test Accessibility and Accommodations (TAA), which is in [ACT Success](#). If staff create the TAA account, it may take ACT three to five business days to verify the account. Here are some resources to help with the process:

**Hard deadlines** for accommodations are:

- Test Event 1 (Feb. 24-Mar. 6): **January 14 CLOSED**
- Test Events 2 (Mar. 10-20): **January 28 CLOSED**
- Test Event 3 (Mar. 24-April. 3): **February 11**

#### Relatives and/or Athletic Coaches with SD-ACT

**Athletic Coaches** (any head or assistant coach of any high school or college athletics program, whether or not the sport is in season at the time of testing) and

**Relatives** (children, stepchildren, siblings, spouses, parents, and persons under your guardianship or anyone who resides in your household):

May NOT serve as test coordinator

MAY assist in ACT Now but shouldn't have the Test Coordinator (TC) role. They MAY help the temporary TC with the tasks.

MAY help train staff

May NOT have access to secure test materials before or after testing.

- Secure test materials include Secure materials include MyACT Instructions for Students, student authorization tickets with students' individually assigned username and passwords to access the tests, and any used scratch paper.

MAY serve as a room supervisor, but may not supervise one-to-one testing for a relative or athlete

#### SD-ACT Student Upload

We updated the students in ACT Now last night. The update is from 2/10/26. You will need to check your roster and assign students to the correct test window. Assigning students to the correct test windows will ensure they get their test materials on time. FYI, you can always print the students' MyACT instructions that were not shipped due to late adds. To do this, log into ACT Now, click on the

Students Tab, click Reports, and click to generate the MyACT Instructions. See screenshot below. If you see students in your ACT Now that should not be testing (seniors, alternate assessment takers), please mark them as “Will not test” within ACT Now.

### SD-ACT To-Do List

This list was sent to testing coordinators yesterday from ACT. We wanted to make sure you saw it:

1. Prepare students for testing:
  1. Provide *MyACT Instructions for Students* form to students.
  2. Provide the *Taking the ACT* booklet to students.
  3. Provide the [Information for Examinees](#) web page link to students. It contains test preparation resources, a practice test, and information about what to expect on test day.
2. Prepare materials for test day:
  1. **Paper Testing (for approved accommodations only):** School test coordinators prepare answer documents.
  2. **Paper Testing (for approved accommodations only):** Students complete answer document demographics (must be completed before testing begins).
  3. **Paper Testing (for approved accommodations only):** Students must complete required information as outlined in the task cards (verbal instructions) even if there is a barcode label on the answer document. If there is no barcode label, the school test coordinator must also fill in the ACT Student Code on the answer document.
  4. **Online and Paper Testing:** Students complete non-test information in MyACT. MyACT account creation is recommended but not required.
3. Read the ACT policies and review the resources on your ACT-hosted web page or in ACT<sup>®</sup> Test Center Manager<sup>™</sup> (ACT<sup>®</sup>TCM<sup>™</sup>).
4. **Verify that all students who will be testing are registered in ACT<sup>®</sup> Now and a test event has been assigned.** Verify the **Delivery Format** is appropriately set as **Online**. Confirm students' grade level and other identifying information is accurate.
5. If testing online, confirm the correct version of the TestNav application is installed on every testing device.
6. Verify that students testing with accommodations have the correct accommodations information associated to their registration. Prepare materials for each student based on approved accommodations on the Decision Notification.
7. Use the [Test Day Activities Checklist](#) to help prepare yourself and your staff for test day. School test coordinators and room supervisors should review the document to understand what to do in ACT TCM for paper and online testing, including:
  1. Logging in to ensure access to ACT Now and ACT TCM
  2. Opening and closing test rooms
  3. Monitoring student testing activity

*Note: The South Dakota Department of Education requires all standard-time testing to be administered online. Any reference to paper testing applies to approved accommodations only.*

- DOE will assign the **NEW shortened 2026 Refresher Training** to TCs and TAs who successfully completed the full 2025 Training Modules.
- 2026 Training Modules (or 2026 Refresher Training for those eligible) will be available to TCs and TAs.
- TAs must complete their training before their students' test will open for administration.
- TAs can show students [MSAA Sample Items](#) to become familiar with the system.
