SSO PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

- Children 18 years or younger
- A person 19 to 21 years old that meets the state definition of having a physical or mental disability



AREA ELIGIBILITY

School Data	Census Data
At least 50% of children enrolled at the site are approved for free/reduced price school meals	At least 50% children in a Census Block Group (CBG) or Census Track must be eligible for free/reduced price school meals
CEP schools: individual school's ISP is multiplied by a factor of 1.6. If result is at least 50%	Must use the most recent data available
Site is located within the geographical boundaries of a school attendance area	Census Data: <u>USDA Area</u> <u>Eligibility Mapper</u>
School Data: October CANS list	Area eligibility can be used for 5 years

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY – OPEN SITE

- Site Eligibility requirements met: 50% F/R, CEP, Census
- Meal reimbursement: NSLP/SBP free rates for all eligible child meals
- Serves all children through age 18
 - and persons aged 19 to 21 that meet the state definition of having a physical or mental disability
- Participants:
 - From the community, surrounding area, visiting the community
 - Children from day care centers may eat but the center cannot also claim reimbursement for the meals



CLOSED ENROLLED

- Eligible children participating in a specific program or activity
- Meals are reimbursed all FREE when Area Eligibility is met
- Only meals served to F/R eligible children are reimbursed FREE if Individual F/R Eligibility is collected. Allowed for day camps only.
- Summer school is not allowed under SSO.



GRAB AND GO MEAL SITES



- Available for summer 2023
- Available to area eligible rural sites with no congregate meal service options
 - https://www.fns.usda.gov/sfsp/rural-designation
- Grab & Go or Home Delivery
- Limited bulk meals or multiple meal service options
- Follow all other SSO standards
- Townhall on 3/22 from 2:30pm CT / 1:30pm MT



MOBILE FEEDING SITES

- USDA Policy Memo SP 02-2014:
- Each location must meet site eligibility and other program requirements
- Extra precautions to protect food safety
- Site supervisor must be present at each meal service
- State and sponsor monitoring visits and reviews must adhere to the same requirements as all SSO sites
- Inclement weather plan





EXCESSIVE HEAT



- Non-Congregate Feeding option for outdoor summer meal sites experiencing excessive heat
- Applies to outdoor sites
- Prior approval required
 - Preapproval form found in iCAN SNP Application >
 Download Forms > SSO or SFSP Outdoor Sites Excessive
 Heat Demo for Non-Congregate Feeding
- USDA Memo SP 14-2018



MEAL TYPES

- Breakfast
 - Must be served in the morning hours
- Lunch
 - Must be offered between 10am and 2pm
- Snack
 - Must be evenly spaced between other meals
- Supper
 - Must start before 7pm and end by 8pm



MEAL OPTIONS OPEN OR CLOSED ENROLLED

- Serve any combination up to two meals or a meal and a snack per day, except:
 - lunch and supper cannot both be claimed in the same day
- Use the NSLP/SBP meal pattern guidelines and rules
- Second meals are not reimbursable

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PRODUCTION RECORDS - FLEXIBILITY

- Daily Production Records are required every day!
- Open sites:
 - Breakfast K-12 age/grade group allowed
 - Lunch may use K-8 or 9-12 age/grade group,
 depending on population attending
 - Must complete an addendum with justification
 - Addendum found in iCAN/Download Forms/SSO
- Closed Enrolled must use applicable age/grade groups



MENU PLANNING – BREAKFAST

- Same meal pattern as SBP during the school year
- Follow age/grade group requirements
 - A single (K-12) age/grade group is allowed
- USDA Memo SP 05-2022





MENU PLANNING – LUNCH

- Same meal pattern as NSLP during the school year
- Follow age/grade group requirements
- Open sites can use K-8 or 9-12 age/grade group menu with preapproval, an addendum must be completed to use K-8 or 9-12 age/grade group menu

MENU PLANNING – SNACK

- Serve 2 food items from any of 5 components
 - Meat/Meat Alternate
 - Grain
 - Fruit
 - Vegetable
 - Milk
- Use the Breakfast/Afterschool Snack production record





MILK

- Allowable pasteurized, fluid milk options:
 - Fat-free & Low-fat (unflavored or flavored)
 - Lactose-reduced or lactose-free (fat-free or low-fat)
- Must offer at least two choices at breakfast and at lunch



OFFER VERSUS SERVE

- Allowed, but not required
- Must train staff to identify OVS reimbursable meals
- Full meal must be offered to every child
- Children must take at least 3 components
 - Two must be full serving size
 - One must be at least ½ cup fruit and/or vegetable

- Instructions to children indicating what food items or components are in the full meal
- And the minimum food items or components selected using Offer vs. Serve



ADULT MEAL GUIDANCE

- All children must be fed first
- Meals served to adults that work directly with the SSO may be served free of charge, these are "Program" adults
- Nonprogram Meals: All other adult meal sales must be sold at a price that covers the cost of the meal and must be documented as income from outside of the nonprofit school food service account
- Count each meal type separately: eligible children,
 Program Adults, Nonprogram Meals
- USDA Policy Memo SP 09-2017 and CANS Memo 223-1



OFF-SITE MEALS (FIELD TRIPS)

- Field trip meals do not need to be preapproved by CANS
- Production Records must be completed if claiming meals for reimbursement
- Same as NSLP/SBP rules
- Must keep original site open





ONSITE MONITORING

- At least once during program operation
- Recommended during first three weeks
- Planned date submitted with application
- Form can be found in iCAN SNP > Application > Download Forms > SSO Onsite Monitoring Form



ONSITE MONITORING

- Menu Planning
- Meal Counts/Claiming
- Meal Service Procedures
- Production Records
- Record Keeping
- Civil Rights
- Sanitation/Food Safety
 - SOP's and HACCP plans up to date and signed



REIMBURSEMENT

- Free NSLP/SBP rates apply
- Submit claims in iCAN SNP, similar to NSLP and SBP
- Cannot combine claim months
- Claims due by the 10th day of the month following operation

- Program Application
- Copy all Advertising
- Menus
- Production Records
- Meal Counts
- Claim
- One Monitoring Visit
- SOPs & Temp Logs





PROGRAM REVIEWS

- Reviews completed on sites with an Administrative Review during the immediate previous school year
- NSLP/SBP regulations
- Reviews completed on new sites
- Reviews completed on any sites receiving a complaint










NEXT STEPS

All Child Nutrition Programs (SNP, CACFP, SFSP):

Certain CACFP and SNP waivers are set to expire 30 days after May 11, 2023. Waivers, including Offsite Monitoring of the Child and Adult Care Food Program and School I Shelters will also expire. This waiver temporarily authorized reimbursement for meals and snacks served to young adults, ages 19 through 24, in emergency shelters partici

USDA has provided clarification on the expiration of these waivers in the following two memos:

- SP 03-2023, CACFP 02-2023 Offsite Monitoring of the Child and Adult Care Food Program and School Meal Program After the Public health Emergency Ends
- CACFP 03-2023 Reimbursement for Meals and Snacks Served at Child and Adult Care Food Program Emergency Shelters after the Public Health Emergency Ends

Each memo provides links to the specific waivers that will be expiring with the end of the Public Health Emergency. Expiration of these waivers does not have an impact on

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


SOUTH DAKOTA FARM TO SCHOOL GRANT
