## **ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION OPTIONS**

This document highlights options made available through the 2017 educator certification rules

Alternative Certification Paths for Teachers	
General Education (GEA)	Leads to a secondary or K-12 preparation with corresponding endorsement areas.  • K-12 preparation include: Art, Health, PE, Music, Reading, World Languages, Computers, Gifted Education, School Library, Deaf or Hearing Impaired, Blind or Visually Impaired, English as a New Language and South Dakota Indian Studies.  • GEA is not intended for individuals who want to teach CTE, Special Education, Early Childhood or K-4 Elementary Core content.  • After completion of requirements, applicants may add other endorsements based on the preparation.  • To add CTE endorsements, applicants must complete the CTE methods course.  • To add Special Education, applicants have two options:  • meeting the K-12 Special Education endorsement requirements, or  • completing Alternative Certification for Special Education.  • Early Childhood and K-4 Elementary Education requires a university preparation program.  • https://doe.sd.gov/oatg/teacheredprograms.aspx
Career and Technical Education (CTE)	Leads to a CTE preparation. Individuals going through this pathway may also add endorsements for other areas such as math, science, etc.  Individuals who want to teach CTE but not complete the additional coursework requirements may prefer to apply for a CTE Instructor Permit. The permit is limited to
	only CTE pathways, and individuals may not add other endorsements except those specifically available through that route.
Teach for America (TFA)	Applicants must be participants in the Teach for America (TFA) program. According to the TFA website, applicants must have a bachelor's degree with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50.
Special Education (SPED)	Applicants must have a valid teaching certificate and 3 years of teaching experience within the past 5 years prior to applying for this option.
