Attending School

Must meet the following

- School administrator verifies student will not graduate on time because of a credit deficiency
- Authorization from a court services officer
- A court order requiring student to enter the program
- Verification a student is under the direction of the Department of Corrections
- Student is enrolled in a Job Corps program

These requirements are established by <u>South Dakota</u> <u>Codified Law (SDCL) 13-27-1</u>.

Receiving Alternative Instruction

• Parents/guardians who choose to provide alternative instruction must **FIRST** file an <u>Alternative Instruction Notification</u> with the South Dakota Department of Education.
