Attending School

Must meet the following

- School administrator verifies student will not graduate on time because of a credit deficiency
- Authorization from a court services officer
- A court order requiring student to enter the program
- Verification a student is under the direction of the **Department of Corrections**
- Student is enrolled in a Job Corps program

These requirements are established by South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL) 13-27-1.

Receiving Alternative Instruction

 Parents/guardians who choose to provide alternative instruction must FIRST file an Alternative Instruction Notification with the South Dakota Department of Education.
