State General Assessment Accommodations for Grades 3-8

Recommended deadline for submitting accommodation requests (through TIDE Forms) was **Feb. 1, 2026**. **Submit accommodation requests in ASAP.**

TIDE forms include:

- Assessment Non-Embedded Accommodations Request
- General Assessment Print on Demand Request
- General Assessment Reading Passages Request
- Special Accommodation Consideration Request
- Speech-to-Text and/or Word Completion Request Form

It may take a week for the state to review and complete these requests, depending on the number of requests received.

ACT Q&A from Summative Assessment Trainings

1. I thought I saw somewhere that if you mark students absent, it is an irregularity? Is that wrong? Does it only apply to district testing, not state testing? **If they mark a student absent, the system will autogenerate an irregularity. The site can then use the irregularity report to help them determine who has tested or who they would need to test on a future date.**
2. In TCM, what do I choose for students needing standard time but testing over two days using the flexible schedule policy? **Choose Standard Time, Single Day. Multi-Day is ONLY for students with the approved accommodation to test over multiple days.**
3. Is the only allowable scratch paper the student's test ticket? Or is it the MyACT claim code sheet? What if the student needs more scratch paper? I read it is the test ticket, but some districts were certain it was the claim code page. **It would be the test ticket. If they would need more, the school would need to provide and collect after the session.**
4. Do the test tickets come in the FedEx box? Or is it just the MyACT claim codes? **Just the MyACT instructions with the claim codes, they would print the authorization tickets from TCM. 5. During the extended break, can students eat lunch with other students in the school who are not testing? Schools have lunch periods where all students are together, so this question came up. **Yes--they can have lunch together; however they need to monitor for prohibited behavior. We have this note that is in the flex policy.**
Special location: While local logistics are up to the test coordinator, it may be easiest to designate a special location for students to take their extended break at the school. This supports easier coordination of examinees and monitoring of any prohibited behaviors.
6. I know students cannot have their cell phones during the extended break. However, why would having a cell phone be different than a student having their cell phone between day 1 and day 2 of testing with the flexible schedule policy? (They can have their cell phone between testing days, right? I assume so, since they would be going home in the evening). **For cell phones, the same policy for prohibited behavior and sharing content applies after testing is completed as for those who test over multiple days; they should not share content.**
Prohibited behavior: All policies for prohibited behavior must be enforced, especially discussing or sharing test questions, answers, or test form identification numbers at any time, including during test administration, during breaks, or after the test.

This is the verbal instruction we use for 2-day testing as well as all accommodations that are multi-day.

Testing will resume on (give the date) promptly at (give the time). Test materials may not be removed from this room. Remember, discussing or sharing test content, test form identification numbers, or answers is prohibited, including on social media. You may not access your cell phone or other electronic devices until you leave the building.

7. I just wanted confirmation that snacks for a diabetic during testing was a designated support, not an accommodation. I found it in the accessibility document, but wanted confirmation. **If locally authorized by the TAC/TC, then they may bring and consume snacks/food during the test. As long as it does not destroy their test/answer doc or cause distractions (loud package for example). The student does not need to be in a 1:1 room unless they are using accommodations (if approved) or supports that require individual testing.**

SD-ACT Test Window 1

Steps for Testing Coordinators to complete during testing:

1. Assign the test event to students before they test.
2. Enter and review any irregularities in ACT® Test Center Manager™ (TCM) as soon as possible (no later than 3 days after the end of the test event). Use Irregularity reports to identify any students who were absent on their originally scheduled test day and assign them to new test events and rooms in TCM.

Accommodations for SD-ACT

The deadline for districts to request accommodations for SD-ACT has passed. If you get a new student who needs accommodations, please follow this process:

1. **Complete** the [Qualified Exception to the Deadline \(QED\)](#) form.
2. **Upload** form to **Other Documentation** in TAA.

3. **Verify** all required documentation is complete and accurate, including the QED form, before selecting submit in TAA. *Important: If the examinee is denied for any reason under the Qualified Exceptions to the Deadline window, ACT will not review any reconsideration request for the examinee for this administration.*

SD-ACT Student Upload

We updated the students in ACT Now yesterday afternoon. The update is from March 1 or March 2. You will need to check your roster and assign students to the correct test window. Assigning students to the correct test windows will ensure they get their test materials on time. FYI, you can always print the students' MyACT instructions that were not shipped due to late adds. To do this, log into ACT Now, click on the Students Tab, click Reports, and click to generate the MyACT Instructions. If you see students in your ACT Now that should not be testing (seniors, alternate assessment takers), please mark them as "Will not test" within ACT Now.

MyACT accounts

In order for your students to utilize the four free score sends, they need to create a MyACT account and claim the MyACT student code within two days of testing. **It is recommended for students to complete this before testing.** Need support? Check out [the MyACT User Guide](#)! The MyACT instructions are included in the initial shipment from ACT. You can also access the MyACT instructions in ACT Now à Student tab à Reports.

- **REMINDER:** Students need to create their MyACT accounts no later than TWO calendar days after testing to complete their non-test information, receive their scores in their accounts, and be eligible to send free score reports. ACT recommends schools host in-class sessions to create and complete their MyACT accounts. MyACT account creation is recommended but not required.
