- As the school year winds down, the Department of Education is reminding districts of the requirement to provide year-end data. Please

- June 13 is the last day for districts to finalize their 2024-25 data. The Year-End Signoff document is due back to <u>DOE.Accountability@state.sd.us</u> by June 20 at 5 p.m. (CT).
