- **WIDA Self-Paced Professional Learning Courses**

Are you looking to build your skills and deepen your understanding of how to effectively support English learners? The Department of Education is offering 12 WIDA self-paced professional learning courses designed for K–12 educators who work with ELs across all content areas. WIDA Screeners

Attached is information previously shared this summer regarding the WIDA Alternate Screener. Please review so you are familiar with when and how it should be administered.

Shari has also received questions about the WIDA Kindergarten Screener certification course and thinking that it is not available until September 26. This certification and date is actually referring to the Kindergarten ACCESS. All WIDA Screener certifications are updated and available to complete.

ACT

As a reminder, all juniors will take the SD-ACT this spring. A few clarifications:

- Juniors can still exit the EL program based on ACT results. Students will receive a level between 1–4 depending on their composite score. We will continue to use the criteria of a 4 on ACCESS and a 3 or 4 on the state assessment (which is now SD-ACT). The exact score ranges for each level will be determined at a later date.
- First Year in Country (FYIC) EL students may still be exempt from the English language arts portion of the SD-ACT. Districts must submit a test irregularity form for each qualifying FYIC junior, available on the ACT website. More details to come.
