SD-ACT Updates

ACT Q&A

During our first AC Check-In on Monday, Oct. 6, there were some questions that came up regarding the ACT. Please see below for the answers to the questions. Here is the [recording from the Oct. AC Check-In](#).

- *Do we need to administer the ACT in one day, or can it be split over two days?*
 - It can be split over two days; however, students must take the SD-ACT in a specific order. See below for an example of how the schedule could be divided between the two days.

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- *The accommodations consent form- is this just for district use or does it need to be uploaded with the state? Does this form need to be done every year?*
 - This is for district use. This does not have to be done every year; it would just need to stay on file for a year after the student tested.
- *Do districts need to do anything to transfer accommodations for students who took national testing for the state testing? Is there a process for this?*
 - Yes, they will need to associate the student to the test date, instructions are found starting on page 15 of the [test accessibility and accommodations\(TAA\) user guide](#).
- *Will there be a guide coming out soon for items like: table separation, bathroom breaks, etc.?*
 - Yes, the modules/manuals for spring are being finalized; stay tuned.
- *Will text to speech be available for all kids as deemed necessary?*
 - Text to speech is an accommodation that would need approval and would be available for all students who are approved.

SD-ACT Accommodations

Districts should begin requesting accommodations for the SD-ACT as soon as possible. District staff will need to create an account in Test Accessibility and Accommodations (TAA), which is in [ACT Success](#). Putting Supports and Accommodations in TIDE

Even though the IDEA indicator is not showing in TIDE, districts are still able to put in the designated supports and accommodations. Districts are also still able to request accommodations for students through the forms found in TIDE. SD DOE has a work around to be able to enable/mark those accommodations to ensure students have them for interim assessments.
