

STATE AGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW SUMMARY

Some teachers write if a student brought a cold lunch or if they were absent and some days complete student names are crossed out. This resulted in 5 meals not being counted or claimed for reimbursement. 7 CFR 210.7 (B) (iii) and (iv) requires that meal counts are correctly recorded, consolidated and reviewed for accuracy prior to submitting the monthly Claim for Reimbursement.
