As a result of missing and incomplete vegetable servings every week of the school year, the weekly vegetable sub-group requirements are routinely not met. (Dark green, red/orange, bean/pea, starchy, and other) 10) There were no production records maintained for December 7, 2018-February 26, 2019. 11) The SFA is claiming incomplete meals for reimbursement. On the day of review, the reviewer observed at least 1 breakfast and 1 lunch that did not contain all of the required components. 12) The SFA is not maintaining complete production records for breakfast and lunch each day. The production records for the entire school year were reviewed. The records that were made available were incomplete. They did not include the actual number of portions served, the component contribution, the serving size, or the complete menu offered. There were also a significant number of days where a production record was not maintained. 13) Signage is not posted near or at the beginning of the serving line identifying what constitutes a reimbursable meal for breakfast and lunch. \boxtimes **School Nutrition Environment** YES NO \boxtimes **Food Safety** \boxtimes Local School Wellness Policy \boxtimes **Competitive Foods** Other: Resource Management, Professional Standards \boxtimes Finding(s) Details: 1) The SFA's food safety plan does not contain the required elements, the SOP's are not complete and/or signed by all staff. 2) The SFA is not completing the weekly food safety checklist. 3) The SFA did not have the most recent food safety inspection report posted in a publicly visible location. 4) Temperature logs are not being maintained for all food storage areas. 5) Storage violations were observed on-site. The SFA had food that was not dated upon delivery and the SFA had food that was not stored 6 inches off the floor. 6) The SFAs Local Wellness Policy does not contain all the required components. 7) The SFA did not provide documentation showing that nonfederal funds were transferred into the food service fund to pay for free staff meals. 8) Students are not being charged for an additional milk. The School Nutrition Program Director did not meet the training requirements and did not have scheduled/planned trainings for the remainder of the school year to meet annual training requirements.
