

STATE AGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW SUMMARY

The daily minimum of 1 cup was not met Thursday for grades K-5 with the 1/2 banana and 4 oz. juice served. The federal regulations require minimum weekly amounts for fruit. The weekly minimum of 4 cups was not met for grades K-5, with 3-3/4 cup served. No more than half of the fruit or vegetable offerings may be in the form of juice. The menu met 53.3% juice for the week of menu review for grades K-5.
