# Visit with your administrator to discuss expectations

Get a feel for his/her vision for the school and understanding of your role. Discuss your responsibilities for the school year.

# TIP3

### Complete an Annual Administrator Conference

This makes sure you are both 'on the same page' for your <u>school counseling program's goals</u>.

# TIP4

#### **Gather and collect data**

Gather data to understand your school's strengths and areas for growth, such as achievement data. Collect supplemental data on perceived needs through needs assessments.



### **Prepare introductory materials**

Create a brochure, presentation, and/or website to introduce yourself and the role of the school counselor to parents, teachers, students, and the community.



# Present "Meet the Counselor" lessons

Present about your role as a school counselor to every class. Educate teachers on your role and meet with parents to explain what you do.



# Become familiar with a comprehensive school counseling model

Utilize a comprehensive school counseling program in your school setting.



### Avoid the therapy trap

Explain that school counselors provide short-term individual and small-group counseling, not long-term therapy.



# Complete a yearly calendar of activities

Update this yearly to have a roadmap of your plans for the school year. View a calendar template on the <u>DOE School Counseling page</u>.



### Track your time

A use-of-time assessment will show how much time you spend on direct and indirect student services. The <u>Use-of-Time Calculator</u> is one type of assessment to track time.



### Establish an advisory council

This group should meet at least twice a year and is valuable to assist in validating and advocating for your program.



### Plan your professional development

Consider which conferences, workshops, webinars, etc. you plan to attend for the school year to keep up with pertinent topics.

#### Practice self care
