WORKFORCE EDUCATION FUND

Background:

Established in 2013 via SB 235, the Workforce Education Fund (WEF) receives 30% of the Building South Dakota Fund annually. The WEF currently is solely used to support secondary CTE programs through Workforce Education Grants.

WORKFORCE EDUCATION GRANTS – OVERVIEW

Purpose:

Support transformative improvements in CTE programs for middle and high school students by funding projects that align with high-skill, high-demand, high-wage careers in South Dakota.

Eligible Applicants:

- Local Education Agencies (LEAs)
- Private, nonprofit entities

Projects must show sustainability, alignment to workforce needs, and completion capacity.

Funding Details:

- Grants began in FY2016.
- Up to \$250,000 may be awarded to nonprofit CTE providers.
- A 1:1 match is required; projects must be completed in 18 months



PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

Projects Must:

- 1. Build, reform or enhance an approved secondary CTE program;
- 2. Align to high-skill, high-demand, and high-wage careers and postsecondary education programs in South Dakota; and
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to complete the project.

Project Categories Include:

- 1. Evaluation for alignment to postsecondary education and workforce demands;
- 2. Development of career pathways or programs of study;
- 3. Development of career guidance or work-based learning programs;
- 4. Educator training;
- 5. Facilities;
- 6. Equipment; or
- 7. Instructional materials.

Priority Considerations:

In accordance with ARSD 24:10:47, grants favor projects that:

- A project evaluating local CTE systems for the purposes of redesigning approved secondary CTE programs;
- An innovative project demonstrating alignment to postsecondary education and South Dakota workforce needs and including work-based learning, dual or concurrent credit courses and any applicable CTSO;
- A project which includes collaboration between multiple secondary schools;
- A project demonstrating partnerships with postsecondary education and business or industry;
- A project including industry-grade practices, equipment, and student certifications;
- A project integrating academic content, work-readiness skills, and entrepreneurship education;
- A project increasing access to and support for approved secondary CTE programs in rural areas;
- A project including plans for sustainability;
- A project which supports the retention of highly effective teachers, career counselors, and administrators for approved secondary CTE programs.

Grants Awarded:

Grants totaling \$8,308,244.31 have been awarded from FY2016 through the end of FY2025. A complete history of school districts and other entities awarded Workforce Education Grants can be found at the end of this report.

PROJECT EXAMPLES

Custer School District

The Custer School District is set to enhance its Career and Technical Education (CTE) offerings by constructing a 19,000-square-foot addition to Custer High School, alongside remodeling 5,500 square feet of the existing structure. This initiative aims to address local and regional workforce demands by broadening the district's CTE programs.

The expansion will equip students with high-quality, industry-standard resources across various CTE programs. Highlights include larger, enhanced woodshop and welding classrooms with improved safety features; larger, modernized Culinary Arts spaces with commercial-grade equipment; and a new technology area featuring a green screen and editing suites. Additionally, existing spaces will be converted into classrooms, paving the way to offer new programs and opportunities for students such as Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources program offerings. The expansion also allows for the continuing development of additional Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSO).

CTE prepares students for in-demand careers with real-world skills that fuel workforce and economic growth.

Huron School District

The Huron School District (HSD) project is an approximate 11,500 square foot addition to the west of the existing high school. This addition includes two CTE classrooms and two CTE lab spaces. As a result, four career clusters and five new courses will benefit. Three surrounding rural schools have committed their support and partnership in sending students to Huron for CTE classes they are unable to offer locally.

The district aims to provide career exposure and exploration that may alter the trajectory of a student's future. The courses that they will offer will directly impact and assist in developing South Dakota's talent pipeline for workforce development and economic growth.

Learners who participate in the new courses will be better prepared for success in Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Manufacturing, STEM, and Transportation, Distribution and Logistics by sheer virtue of the professional experiences they will be afforded and the relationships they will build in the process. The district will take advantage of the infrastructure constructed in this project to open doors to new partnerships, continue to build upon current partnerships, and grow our learners.

OPEN GRANTS

As of July 16, 2025, there are two Workforce Education Grants open with a balance of \$443,284.00 remaining on the grants. Details of the open grants are in the table below:
