What is an Apple?

Over 7,500 apple varieties exist!

Apples are in the rose family, like roses and pears.

They float because they're 25% air.

The science of growing apples is called pomology.

Apple trees can live over 100 years.

The largest apple ever grown weighed 4 pounds! Read trivia for the week.

Apples in South Dakota

South Dakota grows varieties like Honeycrisp and Zestar.

Apple picking season is mid-August to late October.

Historical varieties include South Dakota Ben (1938) and Anoka (1918). Read trivia for the week.

Health Benefits

Apples are a great source of fiber and vitamin C.

They are low in calories and make a healthy snack. Read trivia for the week.

- Choose a different item to focus on each month.
- Hang the poster in the cafeteria where it can be seen by all students.
- Hand out the Fact Sheets and the Recipes for an option to cook at home.
