What is South Dakota Assessment Portal?

The South Dakota Assessment Portal (SDAP) is an online resource used to help educators create, deliver, and track classroom and summative assessments for their students. It is available at no cost to all school districts across the state. Teachers can choose to create tests using items aligned to South Dakota State Standards or create their own.

Within the SDAP, teachers are able to administer a number of assessments, including teacher- and district-created exams, state benchmark tests, and course equivalency exams, with scores accessible almost immediately.

Course Equivalency

- In grades 9-12, students who take a Course Equivalency exam and score at least 85% may receive Pass credit (one attempt).

- Over 13,500 items and growing
- Item banks for Math, Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, and Health
- Teachers can create tests via SDAP in all content areas
- Teachers can join school-, district-, and state-level user groups to work collaboratively
- Pre-made, standard-specific forms available for teachers to use to create tests
- Districts can create their own exams with district created items
- New technology-enhanced and extended-response items

- Individual student reports for state assessments
- Roster report scores
- Summary data
