# **CUP STACK**

**Overview**: Cooperative and problem-solving activities are a great way to teach students about leadership and teamwork. This activity helps students realize that we all have responsibilities for ourselves and our teams.

Estimated time: 10-15 minutes

#### Materials:

- Per group of 5 students:
  - 6 Cups
  - 5 Pieces of String
  - 1 Rubber band

#### Instructions:

- 1. It will be a time saver to have the materials put together before you do this activity. Tie five pieces of string around a rubber band. Repeat this for as many groups you plan to have do this activity.
- 2. Ask students what kinds of responsibilities they have in school and at home (examples: go to school, complete homework, clean bedroom, wash dishes, etc.).
- 3. Now ask students to think about the types of teams they participate in, whether it be for a sport, band, or other type of activity. Ask them to share some responsibilities they have with their team (examples: practice, give best effort, complete the role in which they've been assigned, etc.).
- 4. Break students up in groups of five. Before you distribute the materials, explain that their teams will have 10 minutes to build pyramids out of cups.
  - a. Here are the rules:
    - i. They can't use their hands to move cups.
    - ii. They may only use their string and rubber band to pick up and move cups.
    - iii. Everyone on the team must participate.
- 5. Set a timer and let the fun begin!
- 6. When time is up, bring the whole group back together for processing.

## **Processing/Application Questions:**

- Was anyone frustrated during this activity? How was the frustration handled?
- What did you learn about yourself in this activity and the group you worked with?
- Why was teamwork so important?
- What other skills did your group have to use to complete this activity?
- What responsibilities did you take on to help your team build the pyramid?
- How does this activity relate to taking responsibility in school, at home, on a team?
