The prior December Child Count is used to calculate the number of parents. SEP requires that districts have a survey response rate of at least 20.00%. Districts should make every effort to encourage survey participation across all student demographic groups, specifically race/ethnicity and disability. Parents must complete the survey by May 31, 2026.
