Steps to Amend or Revise the ESSER Application on GMS

Create an Amendment to the ESSER application by clicking the Amend button. (Open original application if it hasn't been approved.)

Go to the Page Lock Control tab and unlock the Private School Equitable Participation section and any other tabs that the LEA will need to revise; ie. Intent and purpose. Then click Save.

Go to Private School Participation Table and enter the low-income student counts from the LEA's Title I School Attendance Areas for resident low-income students attending Private Schools in the same grade span. For convenience the attached table shows the low-income student counts from the Consolidated Application's Participating Title I School Selection Section. The LEA may choose to use the count from either the SY 2019-20 or the SY 2020-21 applications.

Please note that the Nonpublic count from the Title I application may not include all relevant low-income students since participation in the Title I program is not a prerequisite to participate in the ESSER Program. Also, if the private school does not participate in the NSLP, the district may need to reference the attached Title I guidance in order to determine a method for identifying low income students in private schools.

The public and private count dates should be approximately the same time.

A U.S. District Court vacated the U.S. Department of Education's Interim Final Rule using student enrollment to calculate the private school's proportionate amount. In a letter dated September 25, 2020, the U.S. Department of Education stated that it would not take any action against States or local districts that followed the guidance and/or the IFR prior to notice of the court's decision. Going forward, districts must calculate the minimal proportional share for CARES act equitable services according to the formula provided in Section 11770(a)(4)(A) of the ESSA. (Title I Part A method)

Affected districts must recalculate the proportionate share using the count of low-income students residing in participating Title I school attendance areas and grade spans in the new table below. The district should reference its Title I application to obtain the public-school counts. The private school counts may vary from the Title I application because a private school's participation in the ESSER program is not dependent on its participation in the Title I program.

1. Districts are responsible for providing equitable services and benefits to eligible private school students, teachers and other educational staff. You must upload the appropriate consultation documentation and provide activities.
